We are not the "A"SPCA. It's a common misconception and we often get asked "do you put out those sad commercials?" - the answer is no.

The names might seem similar but the SPCA you know and love is not an ASPCA. Both organizations are working for the well being of companion animals, believe in spay and neuter, have animal adoption facilities, and are registered 501c3 non-profits. But that's where the divergence really happens.

We are located in Kalamazoo, Michigan and have been since 2002. We are a local, grassroots organization with no ties to any national organizations. The ASPCA has their head quarters in New York City and funds activities going on all across the U.S. We focus on companion animals where as the ASPCA is known to take much broader view when it comes to all animals. In 2016, the ASPCA raised over \$215 Million, little old us in comparison raised \$717,000. The ASPCA distributes funds and grants to other organizations (\$14 million) and also advocates for animal rights nationally via legislative efforts where all of our money stays with us. The ASPCA is one of the largest animal welfare organizations and does great work nationally, setting standards for the animal welfare communities and blazing the path for groups like ours. We are blazing a smaller, but equally impactful path here in West Michigan.

We currently do not receive any funds from the ASPCA or other national originations. We rely solely on fees from adoptions and donations from our supporters. All of our efforts in providing assistance for animals in need stay right here in our community. We need your support more than ever so please consider supporting your local animal rescue!





Why Our Community Programs Are Important



What do we stand for? Our mission and vision is as follows: The SPCA of Southwest Michigan is dedicated to working for the well-being of animals and creating an adoption-focused community in Southwest Michigan. Our goal is to end senseless animal euthanasia in SW Michigan, and provide all animals with a loving, caring home.

This means that our purpose extends beyond just rescuing and rehoming, but also addressing the issues that lead to animal homelessness in the first place. Did you know that it is estimated that 10% of the homeless population are pet owners? This can lead to issues because animals are not permitted in homeless shelters, leaving pet owners few options. Often, they will refuse shelter or any assistance because they won't part with their pets. Human welfare professionals can work to understand a homeless person's relationship with their animal, offer support, and find resolutions that will keep animals with their owners. These include making referrals to low-cost or free veterinary care and to pet food pantries. The SPCA of SWMI is the animal welfare organization that provides these services to our community, the only one working on pet retention based programming. We understand that although low income pet ownership is controversial it is also reality of the world we live in. We believe that the best place for a pet is in the loving care of their owner and we do what we can to help ease the burden of pet ownership by providing food assistance regularly with Loaves and Fishes and medical services at least once a year with Kalamazeuter. These are just two of our programs that provide essential services for the most needy animals in our community. Ending senseless euthanasia is only possible if we address the problems at their root and working to improve pet retention and educate pet owners.
